Debris Clean-up Guidelines and Solid Waste Schedule

Debris Clean Up

In the coming days, the City will be working with our debris management contractor to assess the volume of limbs, yard waste and construction debris. This initial assessment period is necessary to comply with FEMA guidelines for reimbursement. After the initial assessment, our contractor will be working as quickly as possible to remove the debris. The City appreciates your patience during this process, as it could take a few weeks to complete. We ask that you use the following guidelines to help expedite the process:

- Yard Waste (trees, limbs, brush, etc.) should be separated from construction and building materials and placed curbside. Leaves should be bagged or in a container
- Construction and Debris (C&D) materials such as metal awnings, roofing, drywall, carpet, lumber, etc. should be in a separate pile and placed curbside
- All debris piles should be placed by the street in front of your house away from the sidewalk and water meters
- All debris piles should be away from power poles, mailboxes and not directly under power lines

Solid Waste Schedule (week of 9/11 thru 9/15)

- Yard waste pick-up is suspended until the storm debris clean-up is completed (refer to guidelines above)
- There will be no recycling pick-up this week
- If your normal solid waste pick up is Monday & Thursday you will receive service on Wednesday and Thursday

- If your normal solid waste pick-up is on Tuesday and Friday you will receive service Tuesday and Friday (no change)
- Solid waste services (household trash and recycling only) will resume the normal pick-up schedule the week of 9/18.
